☆Kevin Burke(fiddle player/Bothy Band,Patrick Street,Open House,Celtic Fiddle Festival/Ireland)

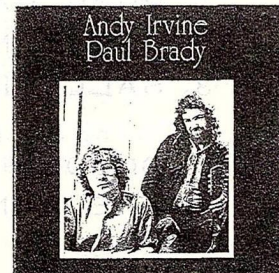

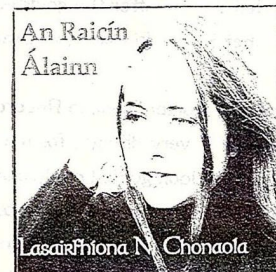

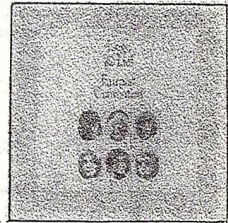
